1. Plant hot weather vegetable seed now — beans, carrots, radishes, squash, corn, and cucumbers.

3. Be methodical about pest control. Check your garden plants from time to time. Don't wait until damage is evident.
4. Feed Roses this month and every month through September with a plant food recommended by your nurseryman. It will promote sturdy growth and profuse bloom.
5. Division and re-plant overcrowded Bearded Iris.
