Courtesy, Kindness Needed on Vacation

"Make a friend this trip — for yourself — your business — your country," a brochure emphasized during the Eisenhower administration.

The idea and the brochure were resurrected this week by Floyd Stark, lay activities leader of the Torrance Seventh-day Adventist Church, 1610 Acacia Ave.

"Consistent Christian witness is what everyone is looking for these days — on vacation, at work, in the home," he notes. His challenge to members of the Torrance Adventist Church is to make a career out of being considerate, tolerant Christian wherever each one finds himself.

CONSIDERING that Americans spend more money and time moving from place to place than those from any other nation, Stark reminds his fellow churchmen this week that they'll likely meet more people on vacation than they do in an average week at home.

"And just because they're on vacation doesn't mean they'll not be looking for courtesy and kindness and thoughtfulness," he declares. "In fact, if we are to judge from a recent survey of American women who said, 'You can't find God in church anymore,' they might be looking for Him among His representatives whom they meet at the campsite, on the mountain trail, or along the sandy beaches.

"CHRISTIANS might well adapt this general American slogan," he suggests, "to a vacation slogan by saying, 'Make a friend this trip — for yourself (we all need friends) — your business (which is Christ-like living) — your country (which includes both Torrance and God's country.)'

Public Hearing Set on Century Freeway Design

A public hearing to discuss design proposals for the Interstate 105 (Century) Freeway and the Interstate 405 (San Diego) Freeway through El Segundo, Los Angeles, Redondo Beach, Lawndale, Hawthorne, Inglewood, and the County of Los Angeles will be held Tuesday, July 8, by the California Division of Highways.

The hearing, set for 7 p.m., will be held in the Hawthorne Memorial Center, 3901 W. El Segundo Blvd., Hawthorne.

The Division of Highways is holding the hearing to acquaint everyone concerned with the design proposal of a portion of this freeway between Sepulveda Boulevard and Route 405 and its effect upon the San Diego Freeway. It will provide interested persons with the opportunity to present their views as well.

GENERALLY, the portion of the Century Freeway from Sepulveda Boulevard to Judah Avenue will be on a viaduct over Imperial Highway. It then turns southerly to cross the San Diego Freeway at 119th Street.

Connections to the city streets will be provided at Imperial Highway, Sepulveda Boulevard, and La Cienega

Boulevard. In addition, Imperial Highway will be widened to eight lanes under the viaduct and Sepulveda Boulevard between El Segundo Boulevard and the Airport Tunnel will be widened to provide additional capacity.

The connections between the Century Freeway and the San Diego Freeway will require extensive modification of the San Diego Freeway. The Hawthorne Boulevard, Inglewood Avenue, Rosecrans Avenue, El Segundo Boulevard, Imperial Highway and Century Boulevard interchanges will be reconstructed. Between Redondo Beach Boulevard and Rosecrans Avenue, one lane will be added in each direction.

FROM ROSECRANS Avenue to El Segundo Boulevard, three lanes will be added in each direction for the south approaches to the Century Freeway. Between Imperial Highway and Century Boulevard, two lanes will be added for the north approaches and the collector-distributor system will be rebuilt.

The Division of Highways will present the results of design studies and call upon government agencies, civic organizations and all interested individuals to express their views. Hearing records will remain open for 10 days during which the public may submit statements to the Division.

Maps showing the designs being considered at the July 8 meeting are now on display at the Division of Highways' Los Angeles Office, 120 S. Spring St., and at the El Segundo, Lawndale, Inglewood, and Hawthorne city halls.
