Puppies come into the world blind and deaf. During the first six weeks they develop their physical capacities, and at around four weeks of age they begin to make social contacts with their littermates and the humans who care for them.

The best time to take a puppy is between 6 and 10 weeks. Prior to that time, he may become overly attached to people and not be able to get along with other dogs. If taken after 12 weeks of age, he'll have a hard time getting used to humans, and will be over timid and frightened.

Be patient and kind to the puppy but not over-permissive.

**BREED OF THE WEEK** — Sealyham Terrier . . . The Sealyham Terrier originated in Wales where he was first bred by a Captain John Edwards for the purpose of hunting foxes, badgers, and otters. No one really knows for sure the breeds used in producing the Sealyham but it is generally believed that the Dandie Dimont, the Bull Terrier, and the Wire-haired Fox Terrier were the probably ancestors of the breed.

The Sealy breeding evolution was carried on during the period from 1850 to 1891. The game little dogs came to be known as Sealyhams after the name of Captain Edwards' country estate. The Sealyham Terrier was first shown at dog shows in England in 1910 and was granted AKC recognition in America in 1911.

THE SEALYHAM has chalked up an enviable record in the comparatively short time that he has been known to the dog loving public. His great charm, tremendous sense of humor, and keen mentality have made him a cherished pet and house dog, and the Sealy's many best-in-show and group wins have increased his fame which has reached such excellence that he can win in the best of company.
