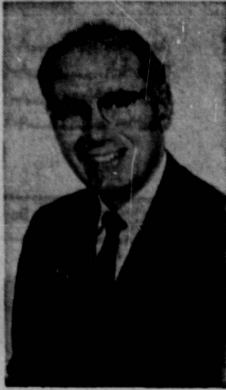


Holborn Assigned To Whittier Church

The Rev. Hans Holborn, pastor of the Riviera United Methodist Church, will preach his last sermon in that pulpit Sunday morning at the 10:10 a.m. service. The service, to be conducted in the new sanctuary at 375 Palos Verdes Blvd., Redondo Beach, will take the form of a family service attended by the church school children and youth with their parents.

The Rev. Holborn will be moving to the East Whittier United Methodist Church in Whittier, a church of about twice the membership of the Riviera Church. The Rev. Robert Fehlman of the Point Loma United Methodist Church in San Diego will succeed Holborn at Riviera. Dr. John Nagel will continue as the associate minister.

'Extras' Banned From Services

Trinity Baptist Church of Arca tried an experiment recently and attempted to simulate a worship service similar to what might be held in a country behind the Iron Curtain.

The topic of Iron Curtain worship came up when some of the members read about the crew of the Pueblo attempting to make a Bible, as best they could, from memory.

ALL HYMN books were collected before the service and no one brought his Bible. All the singing was done from memory and the people were asked to give Scripture verses from memory.

Walter T. Oman, pastor, related that the people had practiced for three weeks saying the Beatitudes, so they included this also in the worship service.

OMAN ADMITTED that the hardest part of the service for him was having nothing in his hands to carry. He had no notes nor his Bible. The sermon was not memorized, but the Scripture was and the general trend of ideas.

He said that standing up before the congregation with no notes or Bible in his hands left him with an uneasy feeling that he had left something at home.

NO ORDER of service was listed, even for the song leader

time. He had previously served four churches there for 14 years before his transfer.

During his ministry here, the Riviera church has almost doubled in membership, the budget trebled, and the valuation of properties increased

about ten times. Adjacent properties were purchased for future expansion, a new parsonage acquired, and the new \$475,000 sanctuary erected.

THE SANCTUARY was completed last September and consecrated by Bishop Gerald Kennedy in February. During his tenure a fulltime associate minister was added to the staff, who presently is the Rev. Dr. John Nagel.

Mrs. Holborn has been active in music throughout the local communities during her stay in this area. She has been director of music at the Riviera church, a violin teacher, and a member of several symphony orchestras and occasional orchestral groups brought together for specific performances.

The departing minister has been president of the former Palos Verdes Peninsula Council of Churches, its department of the ministerial association, and its successor, the Greater Peninsula Council of Churches. He has also been active in many community associations and taken part in several community emphases in this local area.

Randles To Lead Knights

Donald Randles has been elected grand knight of St. Gerard's Council 4919, Knights of Columbus, for the 1969-70 Columbian year.

Others chosen to serve with Randles were Al Lawrence, deputy grand knight; Oren Davis, chancellor; Dennis Ryan, warden; Jack Wolansky, advocate; and Robert Lucas, lecturer.

Representing St. Gerard's Council as delegates to the recent state convention in San Diego were G. K. William Bix, Dick Abshear, and Raymond McLaughlin. Bix was just one vote short of being chosen as a California delegate to the Supreme Convention to be held in New Haven, Conn., in August.

Methodist

Church Attendance Down; Debts Continue Upward

United Methodist Churches in the Southwest have reported a fractional loss of membership, but noted with concern that church attendance dropped more than 11 per cent last year and Church School membership fell more than 13 per cent.

In figures reported to the opening session of the 119th Southern California-Arizona Conference in Redlands, church membership at the end of 1968 was shown to be 1.02

per cent below a year earlier in Southern California, Arizona, Southern Nevada, and Hawaii. Conference Statistician George F. Williams said the total dropped from 267,146 to 264,424 among the 487 congregations.

The sharpest decreases in his statistical report were for average weekly attendance at worship services, which dropped 11.22 per cent from 113,188 to 100,491, and in church school membership which fell 13.24 per cent from

165,955 to 143,983. Williams noted, however, that the latter figure may have reflected some roll-cleaning because attendance at church school classes rose 2.48 per cent from 72,149 to 73,937 per week.

The average indebtedness per member rose from \$114.50 to \$117.90, an increase of almost 3 per cent. The total indebtedness of the churches was \$30.9 million, but in a companion report, Conference Treasurer J. Wesley Hole noted that payments on indebtedness were at the annual rate of \$4.4 million during the past year, which he described as a satisfactory record of debt retirement.

Salaries paid to ministers, while up 3.86 per cent, failed to keep up with the rising cost of living which rose more than 5 per cent last year.

The average giving of each member increased from \$90.84 a year to \$91.68, which is well above the national United Methodist average of \$64.61 in 1967, the latest figure available for the total denomination.

Adventists Support Schools

At a time when schools all across the country are short of funds, members of the Torrance Seventh-day Adventist church will dip deeper into their pockets Saturday and contribute to three schools that are 3,000 miles away and on another continent.

Alfred Gordon, superintendent of the Adventist Sabbath school, reports that the schools slated to receive aid are the church's Northeast Brazil College at Pernambuco, Brazil; Chile College a Chillan, Chile; and Espirito Santo, Brazil. These are only three of 4,800 schools supported by the denomination. Locally members contribute heavily to the support of South Bay Junior Academy, 4400 Del Amo Blvd.

The funds collected Saturday will help to erect new dormitory facilities for the Espirito Santo Academy and the Chile college. They will also help to build a chapel for the Northeast Brazil college.

The Chile college, Gordon says, has been limping along with 260 young men jammed into a dormitory designed to accommodate 150.

Superintendent Gordon states that he expects that the goal enabling this construction will be reached. "Our members firmly believe in Christian education," he says.
