Benefit Show Set at Chapel

A special benefit performance, sponsored by the Lomita Chamber of Commerce, has been scheduled at Chapel Theatre, 2222 W. Lomita Blvd., for Friday, April 11, at 8:30 p.m.

The current Chapel show is the comedy "The Owl and the Pussycat."

Funds from the Chamber-sponsored performance will be used to provide a marquee for the theatre, according to Henry Goethals, Chamber chairman of the event.

TICKETS for the performance will be on sale through Lomita area service clubs, Goethals said. A champagne reception will be hosted by theatre members prior to the performance. About \$1,000 is needed to put

up the marquee, according to Murray Rubin, a member of the Chapel Theatre.

More than \$10,000 has been spent by the theatre to remodel the present quarters. The marquee, Rubin said, is needed to help patrons identify and locate the theatre.

"THE OWL and the Pussycat" is described as an "adult comedy." It stars Duke Schneider and Jo Lasman. Schneider is the winner of Chapel's "Angel" award for his performance in "Rattle of a Simple Man."

Annual Easter Seal Fund Drive Launched

Easter Seals have started to arrive at more than two million homes in Los Angeles County as the appeal for funds to provide critically needed services for crippled children and adults gets underway.

The annual appeal, sponsored by the Crippled Children's Society of Los Angeles County, continues through Easter Sunday, April 6.

Thousands of Easter Seal volunteers throughout the county, including women's organizations, handicapped young adults groups, Girl Scout, and Boy Scout Troops, parent guilds, senior citizen groups, and sorority alumnae groups, have been busy for six weeks preparing this year's mailing.

BECAUSE of this wide-spread volunteer support and the high standard of year around service

provided, the Crippled Children's Society has received the endorsement of the Social Service Department for the 19th consecutive year. It is the only major national health agency to receive this endorsement.

Easter Seals are symbols of hope for the handicapped. Contributions to the drive will be used to provide a variety of direct services to physically handicapped children and their families, including orthopaedic appliances, day camping, resident summer camp, speech therapy, employment training and placement, and group recreational activities.

Crippled Children's Society hopes that all county residents will help call attention to the needs, hopes, and abilities of the handicapped by placing an Easter Seal on all Eastertime letters, cards, and packages.

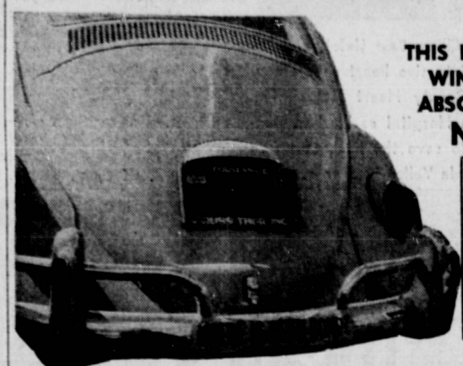
