Senior Citizens Must File Soon

Time is running out for a lot of people over age 65 who live in Torrance. According to Miles Davis, District Manager, Torrance Social Security Office, March 31 is absolutely the last date that people born before October 2, 1901 will ever have to sign up for Medical Insurance under Social Security Medicare.

March 31 is also the last chance people born from Oct. 2, 1901, to Jan. 1, 1904, will have to sign up for this medical insurance until Jan. 1, 1970.

Davis stated that nearly everyone born before Jan. 2, 1903, is eligible for, and need not have ever worked under Social Security at all in order to apply for both hospital insurance and medical insurance. However, an application must be filed with the Social Security Administration not later than March 31.

Eskimo Life To Be Topic Of Program

Life among the northernmost Eskimos will be presented in color film by explorer Lewis Cotlow Monday at 8 p.m. in the El Camino College Campus Theater.

Three thousand miles north of the United States and only several hundred miles from the Pole, the world's northernmost Eskimos lead a harsh, isolated life under cruel climatic conditions that parallel the Ice Age.

Cotlow spent many months with these hospitable human beings — riding their dog sleds, going along on the hunt, eating raw seal liver, sleeping in their igloos. He has recorded in color film events in the daily lives of a happy people and their tenuous survival on the rooftop of the world.
