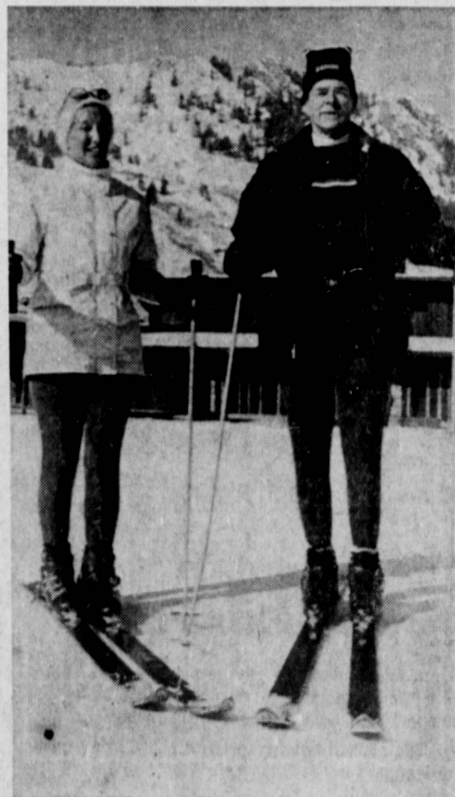
The "outstanding" Candy Striper is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. D. O. Never, who own an office machines company in Wilmington.
