260 Boats Enter Catalina Salute

The fourth annual Salute to Redondo Beach King Harbor at Avalon, Catalina, is off to its best start with 260 boats already signed up for the April 26 and 27 event. A record 240 boats participated last year.

Of the early signers, 73 are from Redondo Beach, 37 from Torrance, and 31 from the Palos Verdes area, the remainder are from in and around the Los Angeles area and from as far east as Redlands.

The big day is April 26, which will be climaxed with a dinner-dance at the Casino Ballroom, a teenage dance at El Encanto, and a kiddie movie at the Casino.

The event is jointly sponsored by the Redondo Beach King Harbor Lessee's Association and the Chamber of Commerce. Dick Fitzgerald, chamber manager, and Harrison Daigh, representing the city, will coordinate the affair.

Tickets for a bottle of champagne, burgees, and badges for owners and guests will be at marina offices prior to the start April 26, 7 to 9 a.m. Dash plaques will be mailed to owners later.

Coast Guard boats will patrol the route, with auxiliary boats stationed every five miles along the way.
