Jewish People Mark Passover

The Passover Festival — which commemorates the deliverance of the Jewish people from slavery in Egypt more than 3,400 years ago — is being celebrated for eight days by thousands of persons in the Greater Los Angeles area at observances provided by agencies of the Jewish Federation-Council and supported by its United Jewish Welfare Fund campaign.

The chaplaincy program of the Board of Rabbis of Southern California will supply Passover foods to persons confined in 36 penal institutions and hospitals in Southern and Central California. Ten rabbis will hold Passover services and sederim, the traditional Passover supper, according to Rabbi Harry Hyman, director of the chaplaincy program.

Passover packages containing prayer booklets and holiday food will be distributed to Jewish persons by Gateways Jewish Committee for Personal Service as part of their year-round visitation program for people in correctional institutions.

As a remembrance of Jews in the Soviet Union, JFC's Committee on Soviet Jewry is circulating a poster protesting the oppression of Jewish religious life in the Soviet Union, it was announced by William H. Chotiner, chairman of the committee.
