Contempt Sentence Served

Land developer Kenneth Bat-trum and three associates spent 24 hours each in jail beginning at 5 p.m. last Friday. The four served the sentences and paid \$500 fines each after they were found in contempt of court. The court held them in contempt for failing to appear and show records in the Civil Service Commission hearings against Walter M. Nollac, suspended city engineer.
Serving the sentence with Bat-trum were Richard Leonard, Teruyuki Fujii, and Robert Schulman. Dudley Gray, attorney for the defendants, has filed an appeal with the State Supreme Court. Earlier appeals to District Court were denied.

Mrs. Iwamoto, who was 35, left a suicide note complaining of despondency. The Iwamotos lived at 4212 W. 173rd St. with their son and daughter, aged about 5 and 6.

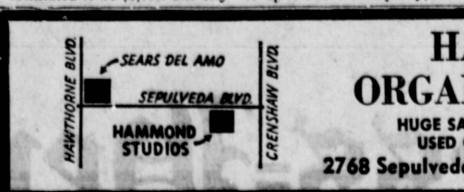

Funds for Crossing Approved

Torrance has been allocated \$2,182 by the California Public Utilities Commission to pay half the city's share of improving protection at the crossing of Western Avenue with the track of the Santa Fe Railroad. Existing protection consists of two wigwag signals, and protection proposed is four flashing light signals.

Cost of the new installation is estimated to be \$8,810. The city and the railroad have agreed to split the cost equally, and the CPUC allocation pays half the city's cost, or one-fourth the total.

The CPUC allocation comes from the crossing protection fund established by the Legislature to aid cities and counties in providing improved protection at hazardous highway-railroad crossings.
