Launch Search For Jobs

The critical need to find employment for Los Angeles county youth will be attacked this spring and summer by the biggest job-finding effort in the history of the California State Employment Service, according to Arthur Morgan, Los Angeles area manpower administrator.

The campaign will operate simultaneously on two fronts, Morgan said. One is to find summer jobs for students who will return to school in the fall. The other is to place youth, who are permanently entering the labor market, in career-type jobs.

Morgan estimates that 21,000 high school graduates out of a total of 69,500 will be seeking permanent jobs. This figure is based on a survey of all high schools in the area administered by him. (Los Angeles county minus Palmdale-Lancaster and Pomona-Claremont.)

MANY OF the 48,480 high school graduates who will go on to college will try to find

employment this summer, Morgan said. In addition, there will be thousands of high school and college undergraduates, dropouts, and older grammar school students seeking work.

Several governmental committees, and private and semi-private organizations will be engaged in summer job campaigns for youth, Morgan said. "The California State Employment Service will cooperate with all of them in the sense that we will both offer our help and accept their assistance."

"During April through August 1968 we were able to find jobs for 33,837 persons between 16 through 21 years of age. In all of 1968 we found 72,376 jobs for young persons," Morgan continued.

"IN 1969, the demand for jobs will be higher and we are not waiting for the summer vacation before we start doing something about it," Morgan stated. "The managers of our eight youth opportunity cen-

ters and 16 employment service offices serving youth have been instructed in procedures, and are enthusiastically ready for the campaigns.
