

## Cal State Sets Summer Session

California State College, Dominguez Hills, will offer its first full summer session beginning June 23, college officials have announced.

The summer session programs have been designed especially to meet the needs of the college community, Dr. Robert Bersi, assistant to the president, said in explaining the plans for the summer program.

One special program will be offered for elementary school children, Dr. Bersi said. It is the result of a survey of community opinion survey conducted by college officials and will provide "enriching" summer experience for children identified as "gifted" or those children with special talents in science areas.

Enrichment classes for two groups of children will meet from 9:30 a.m. until noon beginning July 7. Classes will meet for four weeks.

Each enrichment class will be limited to 25 students and the deadline for enrollment is April 15. Transportation to and from the college must be arranged by the parents, Dr. Bersi said.

Teachers will work under the supervision of Jeanne Delp, a consultant for gifted children employed by the Garden Grove Unified School District, and Dr. Ruth Larson, associate professor of education at the college.

The board offices will verify any assignment of an employee sent to call on a taxpayer, the spokesman said.
