

55 Exhibits Set For High School Science Display

Fifty-five entries have been submitted for competition in the fourth annual Torrance Unified School District high school science fair, it was announced today by Dr. Harold Widney and Dr. Bruce Magner, co-chairmen.

The two-day event will take place Thursday and Friday, April 17 and 18, in the South High School gymnasium, 4801 Pacific Coast Hwy.

In addition to exhibits entered in competition, there will be 30 non-competitive student displays. Completing the exhibits will be a display of special Apollo hardware used in the Apollo space flights which will be loaned to the school district for the event by The Garrett Corporation.

FEATURING outstanding science projects from students of the district's four high schools, the fair will be open to the public from 7:30 p.m. to 9 p.m. Thursday and to students from 8:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. Friday.

Preceding public viewing of the fair, judging will take place from 2 to 4 p.m. Thursday.

Categories to be judged include research briefs and individual and group entries in both physical and biological science. Research briefs will be unaccompanied by displays.

JUDGING will be on the basis of creative ability, scientific thought, thoroughness, technical skill, clarity, and dramatic value. Awards will be presented to the first, second and third place winner in each category, except where there are a limited number of entries.

Director Of Beaches Appointed

A former manager of the Torrance Area Chamber of Commerce Tuesday was named director of beaches for Los Angeles County.

R. L. (Dick) Fitzgerald, the current manager of the Redondo Beach Chamber of Commerce, was appointed by a unanimous vote of the Board of Supervisors.

The 45-year-old former life-guard was No. 1 on the list of eligible candidates prepared by the county's Civil Service Commission. He becomes the first director of the county's newest department.

Fitzgerald has been manager of the Redondo Beach

Chamber since 1955 except for a four-year period when he managed the Torrance Chamber.

He will join the county staff May 1 at a salary of \$23,000 per year.
