In a nutshell, the program provides for establishment of a five-member committee of ex-perts to screen and recom-mend a list of architects for various county construction projects. The final selection will be made, as it is now, by the Board of Supervisors.

Because of increased population and demands for more county services, it has been necessary to embark on a \$391 million capital projects program for the next six years. This fact alone stresses the need for systematic selection of architects.
