## Welfare Decision May Give Taxpayers a Jolt

The Supreme Court decision eliminating a one-year residen-cy requirement for welfare recipients was not unexpected but it may result in a big

jolt to the property taxpayer.

The decision is expected to increase the cost of welfare programs because it will bring more welfare recipients to Cal-ifornia, where the allotments are higher than in most states.

Previously California insist-ed on a one-year residency be-fore a person was eligible for aid. That is a thing of the past.

COUNTY property taxpayers pay roughly 60 cents of their tax rate of \$2.68 per \$100 assessed valuation for welfare. They also pay by way of state and federal taxes. With increased case loads, the costs can only co higher.

creased case loads, the costs can only go higher. This decision should be the milestone which marks the transfer of the welfare obligation from a local responsibility to a state and federal responsi bility. More than anything else

welfare costs are putting the tax rate way out of proportion. It wouldn't be so bad if the county had control over the welfare costs, amount of aid, and eligibility requirements But these are dictated by the state — even the adminis-tration of the program is man-

MORE THAN ever before, now is the time for the state and federal governments to take over the total obligation of welfare and give the needed relief to the counties, which can only finance welfare from

the property taxes.

The state and federal go ernments have other areas of taxation which equalize the load. They are calling the shots and are the logical ones to pay the bill.

Q. My mother has just died at 75. Neither she nor my fa-ther ever worked under social security, but she was receiving \$40 a month from social secu ity because she was over 72. Will social security help pay her burial expenses?

A. No. Social security makes a lump-sum death paymen only when the deceased person has worked the required num ber of quarters under the pro

Q. I am 15 years old and starting my first job. It is only parttime work after school. Do I have to get a social security

A. Yes. Your employer is required to report your wages for social security purposes. You must have a social security number and show it to him so that you get credit for your earnings.

Q. If I become disable while I am young and can't work, can I draw social security payments or are they just for older people?

A. Age makes no difference

in the payment of social security disability benefits. Whether you become too disabled to work at 25 or 55 — any time before you are 65 — you would be eligible for a monthly ben-efit based on your earnings.

Q. Could a young man, say 5, get a better deal by using the same amount of money a his social security contribu tions to buy a private insurance policy?

any private insurance policy,
or package of policies, cannot
provide the same range of protection he gets from social se-curity. Even if such policies were available, they would cost more than social security

Q. I will be 62 in three months. I do not have a birth certificate, but I have secured some documents showing my age and I am attempting to get more. Should I wait until I have all my records before I

have all my records before apply for benefits?

A. No. You should apply now. The people at your social security office will tell you if you have enough evidence of your age. If more is needed, they will help you get the addi-
