This will result in an additional tax collection of more than \$9 million for local taxing than 39 million for local taxing agencies, Watson said, pointing out that in the six years his department has been auditing business property declarations, a total of \$392 million in additional assessed value has been recovered by the county for a six-year additional tax collection of almost \$33 million. tion of almost \$33 million.


