



Professor Wins Top USC Award

A Redondo Beach man has won a top award at the University of Southern California for his outstanding teaching.

Nathaniel Hickerson, assistant professor of education, is one of eight professors nominated by graduating students for the honors. He will receive a \$1,000 award from USC Associates, a group of 300 men and women civic leaders dedicated to academic excellence at USC.

The awards have been made annually since 1960.

Dr. Hickerson, 40, has been a member of the department of the social and philosophical foundations of education at USC since 1966.

He was graduated in anthropology from Columbia University, and received a master's degree in education from Teachers College there. After attending San Francisco State College, he earned the doctor of education degree from the University of California, Berkeley.

Dr. Hickerson has been a high school teacher and administrator, an assistant professor of education at San Francisco State and Tulane University, a lecturer at the University of Florida, and a director of education for the Anti-Defamation League.

HE IS the author of "Education for Alienation" and a number of articles dealing with social foundations and secondary education.

Dr. Hickerson has been a consultant to the Baldwin Park Unified school district on counseling and guidance and to the Fresno Unified school district on problems of school desegregation.

He has also worked on problems relating to the education of Mexican-American children.

Benefit Concert Slated By Accordion Symphony

Included in their program are waltzes, beguines, polkas, folksongs, ballads and classics.

The Yale Accordion Symphony Orchestra has appeared throughout northern and southern California, including a performance at the Hollywood Palladium.

They have been invited to appear Aug. 6 through 9 at the International Cultural Exchange Music Festival in New York City.
