Funeral services for Gerald Edward Reynolds, 57, father of Press-Herald City Editor Jerry Reynolds, were scheduled for 11 a.m. today at Halverson-Leavell Mortuary in Torrance. Mr. Reynolds died suddenly at his home Tuesday evening.

A resident of Torrance in 1953, Mr. Reynolds was a route salesman for the Carnation Co. He was born in Attleboro, Mass., on June 12, 1911. He was living at 2350 W. 250th St., Lomita, at the time of his death.

Other survivors include his widow, Freddie; another son,

Douglas K. of Redondo Beach; and a daughter, Nancy Elaine Reynolds of Torrance. Also surviving are his brother, Merwin Reynolds of North Hollywood, and a sister, Mrs. Walter Dupree, Attleboro, Mass.

Mr. Reynolds was a veteran of Navy service in the Pacific during World War II, and a member of Teamsters Local 144.

The Rev. Hans Holborn of the Riviera United Methodist Church was to officiate at today's services. Burial was scheduled in Green Hills Memorial Park, San Pedro.

Astronaut To Chair Fund Drive

Apollo 8 astronaut Lt. Col. William Anders has been named honorary chairman of the City of Hope's annual Hope Sunday drive, which will be conducted throughout California June 8.

Last Christmas, Colonel Anders was aboard the pioneering flight which took man for the first time to the outer regions of space free of earth's gravity and into orbit just 70 miles above the surface of the moon. Along with fellow astronauts he read from the first 10 verses of Genesis on Christmas Eve while the world watched and listened via television.

As chairman of Hope Sunday, Colonel Anders will lead an army of volunteer marchers seeking contributions for the free, nonsectarian medical and research center near Los Angeles.

THE CITY of Hope is engaged in patient care, research and education against cancer, leukemia and diseases of heredity, the blood, chest and heart.

In the next few days, Colonel Anders will announce local Hope Sunday chairmen.

"The philosophy of the City of Hope is that man is, indeed his brother's keeper," he said.

"No patient ever pays at the City of Hope, and it now takes more than \$14 million a year to keep its doors open to the desperately ill. I am proud to play a role in the City of Hope's dramatic battle against catastrophic disease, and I hope that all residents will respond from their hearts when a City of Hope volunteer calls on them June 8," Colonel Anders added.


