Securing a passport is now a very painless procedure. You must apply in person at the nearest Passport Agency - we have one in Los Angeles. Normal handling may require a week or two between application and receipt of passport, unless an expediting fee of \$2 is paid - and if you are really fee is worth it. New passports are now valid for five years and are not renewable. The old passports (pre-1968) were for three years with a renewal of two years.

For your first passport, five things are necessary: (1) a birth certificate, an affadivit of birth, or naturalization papers — (2) two passport photos (21/2" x 21/2" or 3" x 3") that have been taken within the past six months. They may be black and white or in color, unretouched, glossy, full face, no hat, and with glasses if regularly worn - (3) an appli cation for a passport — (4) the fee, in cash, money order, or check, which is \$12 — (5) personal identification, such as a valid driver's license

Accident and baggage insurance costs very little and chances are that you won't need it - but get it, just in case. Every travel agent has the forms that you must fill out. For example — \$10,000 life insurance with \$1,000 medical for 30 days will cost you \$8.95. Baggage in-surance for the same period

would cost you \$3.80 and the baggage is covered for \$200.

Very important also - most of your funds should be in traveler's checks - small denominations, so they can be changed easily with a small amount of foreign money to turn back in, upon leaving a country. Be sure and record the serial numbers of your travelers checks. I had \$200 stolen in Bangkok and I col-lected because I had the num-bers and reported it right

Results included a 15 per results included a 15 per cent reduction in nervous ten-sion, a six per cent drop in blood pressure, a 4.8 per cent derease in body fat and a 7.2 per cent increase in arm strength.
