COLLEGE REPORT

California State College, Dominguez Hills, as many people know, possesses a unique academic plan. Its concept of dual majors for under-graduates and its inter-disciplinary approach to learning merits explanation. The chairman of the college's Academic Senate, Dr. Jud Genier, does this in the following state-ment he prepared for our un-

"Interdisciplinary fields themselves are not new. In fact, many are older than dis-ciplinary fields. It wasn't until the 19th Century that college education began to break up into separate units like chemistry and geography. Broad fields like 'classics' (made up of language, literature, philosophy, mathematics, history, ge-ography, sociology, military science, etc.) are typical of interdisciplinary studies which are long-established and tradi-

dergraduates:

"THE VALUE of the crossfertilization is recognized in-creasingly today. For example historians who combine with psychologists write meaningful history. Wedding of biology and sociology and economics produce urban studies; geography, politival science and language, Asian Studies; geography, political scingful research done in the world today is inter-

"Dominguez Hills' inter-departmental (inter-disciplinary) fields may be classified in four categories:

"A. Area Studies (example American, Asian, African, Latin American)

"B. Historical Periods (ex ample: 20th Century Thought, Medieval Civilization) "C. Professional Fields

based on several disciplines (Theatre Arts, American Business and Economic Systems, Physical Education)

"D. Newly emerging fields which are interdisciplinary (Information Systems, Urban Studies, International Rela tions, Linguistics)

"Hopefully, a student who chooses a traditional discipline which is narrow will choose an interdepartmental major which is broad and vice versa. Also there is no reason to choose an interdepartmental major from the same school as the departmental major, as the departmental for majors are housed 'schools' for administra' administrative purposes only.

"IN CHOOSING an interrin Chrousing an inter-departmental major, a student may follow what we might call the road of least resistance, that is, select a field closely re-lated to his departmental field. For example, it is not unusual to find history majors choos-ing American Studies; philoso-phy.20th Century thought psy. phy-20th Century thought; psy-chology-behavioral sciences; French-linguistics; economics-American business and eco-American business and economic systems; sociology-ur-ban studies; political science-international relations; mathematics-information systems; chemistry-foundations of natural science. These are 'normal' combinations. But to exchange combinations in these pairings should be 'encouraged. An unusual choice of majors might well enhance the student's awareness and certainly enable him to make unique contributions to the expansion of knowledge.

"Let us cite one example: a major in history normally might choose American Stud-ies because he wishes to be-c o m e a secondary school teacher and may be asked to

range widely over a variety of subject matter connected with the American past. He also may wish to examine closely certain aspects of the American culture in order to gain better appreciation of his heritage and identity or that of minority groups within society. But to concentrate upon American Studies alone tends to make the history major paro-chial and limited in his out-

"IF, INSTEAD, he chooses

or his interdepartmental ma-jor to study another area of the globe such as Latin Amer-ica, or Africa, he is much bet-ter able to draw comparisons and contrasts and to place his own culture in a broader frame of reference. Or if he were to study behavioral science, his history would have greater scientific validity; if he picks ur-ban studies, his history would be of greater value in facing modern problems; if he selects business and economic sys-tems or foundations of natural science, he would be very much in demand as a specialist in a given field; if he se-lects 20th Century thought, he could bring the attitudes and approach of the philosopher to his judgments about man's his judgments about man's past performance and present condition. Even information systems, with its emphasis on contemporary information storage and processing, would give the historian the kinds of tools he might well need to work in his field in the future.

"In sum, the inter departmental major offers the student an out-of-the-ordinary opportunity to broaden his own horizons and at the same time explore new concepts and com-binations of subject matter. The choice of field is important and should be made only after adequate reflection and con sultation, for it will help shape and determine the student's academic career."
