One hundred teachers from Northern California will pick up pointers on how to beef up their reading program from a Torrance teacher next July.

Miss Patricia Oliver, combination second-third grade teacher at Casimir Elementary School, has been invited to present a workshop on "teaching reading through the lan-guage experience approach" July 10 at Chico State College.

Her presentation will be one of several to be given during her 11-day seminar being con-ducted by the Northern Califor-nia Elementary Schools Proj-ect for teachers of 10 counties. The project is financed by The project is financed by Title III of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act.

Miss Oliver teaches a special class for capable students with learning problems. Emphasis in the class has been on overcoming problems in all subjects by stressing reading.

The Rev. Holborn names travel as a favorite hobby, a hobby which he's pursued with great relish.
